Class 35 Best Condition and Turned Out Donkey, any age and sex, conformation will not be taken into account.
The S.E. Tetlow Perpetual Trophy presented by Mrs. S. E. Tetlow for the first prize winner. For Annual Competition.

Class 36 Stallions and Geldings. 4years old and over.
Best Gelding Rosette. Best Novice Donkey Rosette.

Class 37 Mare and/or Mare with own Foal at foot. 4 years old and over. Foals to be 6 weeks old or over at date of show. Foals to be judged first. Best Foal Rosette. Best Novice Donkey Rosette.

Class 38 Young stock.Colt, Filly or Gelding 3 years old and under.
Best 2 year old Rosette. Best Gelding Rosette. Best novice

Class 39 Best Child Handler. Under 16 on day of show, over 3 years. Entry fee £2.00
Prizes: 1st £5.00 2nd £3.00 3rd £2.00
DBS. Rosettes for Young Handler and Young Novice.

CHAMPIONSHIP

For first and second prize winners from Classes 35 – 39 The Greenwood Trophy presented by Mrs. S. M. Greenwood for the Champion Donkey. For Annual Competition.

Class 40 Ridden Donkey.
4 years and over. Minimum age for the rider 3 years

Please Note: Entering one donkey and showing another is not permitted. Stallions and Entire Colts must be properly dressed in bridle and bit with the leading rein correctly attached to the bit. In the 'Mare with Foal at Foot' class, superficial blemishes do not necessarily debar a mare from being awarded a prize.

Definitions: A Novice Donkey is one that has not won a first prize in an in-hand breed class or any novice in-hand breed class at any show up to the closing date of this show. Donkey classes are open to all donkeys and all exhibitors, whether they are members of the Donkey Breed Society or not. Donkey Breed Society Rosettes may only be awarded to Donkey Breed Society Members.

The In Hand Champion Donkey at this show automatically qualifies for the relevant Championship at the DBS Annual Supreme Championship Show on the 18th & 19th August 2007, at Rodbaston College, Stafford. Provided it is owned by a fully paid up member of the DBS. A Donkey may win more than one Championship at shows but will qualify only once for the DBS Supreme Championship Show. Where the In Hand Champion Donkey has previously qualified, the Reserve Champion Donkey will be deemed the Qualifier.
